



WHAT WE'VE DONE ALREADY

Although the Bosque Amateur Radio Club is only a little over a year old, we have grown quickly. Some of our accomplishments so far:

- Successful group purchase of club shirts & jackets, etc.
- Successful deployment of our club website & Facebook page
- Successful monthly meetings with great presentations
- Successful weekly radio nets with growing #s of check-ins
- Successful participation in Explora outreach events
- Successful participation in events like the Run for the Zoo
- Successful participation in the ARRL Rocky Mountain Division Convention

AN EXAMPLE OF ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL HAM CLUB

- Delaware Valley Radio Association, Inc. has a dedicated public relations person
- The <u>www.w2zq.com</u> website is well-maintained and current
- It's located in West Trenton, NJ adjacent to the Trenton-Mercer County Airport (KTTN)
- Its rich history began in the 1930s. The club is "nearly 100 years old!"
- There's a very active membership whose 150+ members span a broad range of ages
- The club station is in a building open to members and visitors on a regular schedule
- DVRA maintains two active repeaters (analog 2m, Fusion 70cm), Wires-X
- They actively and successfully participate in most major ARRL & CQ contests as well as the NJ and other state QSO Parties
- Members engage in statewide charity events like walk-a-thons, MS-150 Bikeathon
- Club members are largely also members of the statewide ARES and RACES ops
- Members maintain the building and grounds on a scheduled basis

AN EXAMPLE OF A SUCCESSFUL HAM CLUB, CONTINUED


- Regular station hours for members and guests:
 - Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday from 1-4 PM
 - Tuesday and Thursday from 6-8 PM
- A DVRA club member can gain acceptance into the "W2ZQ Operators Club" by logging 25 QSOs using the club call sign, W2ZQ
- Operator and Key Holder Training sessions are available during regular station hours
- The website's Club Calendar lists each year's scheduled operating events
- Special Events Station Call signs W2T and W2P are used to commemorate the Revolutionary War battles of Trenton and Princeton. This event starts on December 26th each year. Special QSL cards are sent to 2-way and SWL contacts
- Jamboree on the Air (JOTA) The DVRA plays hosts to local Scouts who are earning their Radio Merit badge. JOTA is typically held on the 2nd Saturday in October
- The nightly Pepper Net is run by club members who are also in QCWA meets at 10 PM
- Presentation tour of the station and antenna farm...























DVRA Is Hamvention 2023 CLUB OF THE YEAR!



OTHER POSSIBLE AREAS OF OUTREACH


- Boy Scouts of America invite girls and boys to JOTA event 8 AM to 1 PM MT on Saturday 21 October 2023


