CLUB REPEATER

I am still looking for a better site for our club repeater. Where it sits right now in the north end of Enchanted Hill works very from the Sunport (farthest south I have tested it) up I-25 to Santa Fe. It does very well east of I-25 but is shaded west of I-25 to most parts of the city. I want a location in the Northeast Heights, or even the crest.

Announcing Yourself on Local Repeaters Gerry Jurrens N2GJ

When repeaters first became popular in the 1970's, radios were crystal controlled and most hams only listened to one repeater at a time. So the protocol at the time of simply saying your call sign and "listening" was sufficient to get a reply. For example "K2GW Listening."

Many folks no longer listen to one repeater but have our radios scan a half dozen local repeaters while we're doing other things in our shack, office, or car. So if you just announce your call sign, my radio may have started scanning again in the 2 seconds before I get a chance to look at it. Thus I have no idea on which repeater to answer you and can't do so. This easily happens a few times each day.

Thus I suggest a slightly different way of announcing yourself to increase your chances of anyone actually answering you. That method is to say "This is (your callsign) listening (a repeater name or frequency)". The initial "This is" gives a scanning receiver a chance to stop before you actually begin to announce your call, and the repeater info tells someone where to reply to you.

Some examples might be:

"This is K2GW listening 67,"

"This is W3AEQ listening W2MER,"

"This is W1PAM listening on Sarnoff 2 Meters,"

"This is W2JIL listening 105,"

"This is N2ARC listening 650," etc.

It really doesn't take much more airtime and might actually get someone to respond to your call.

AMATEUR RADIO EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS ACT

(we have been waiting for so many years for this. Let's keep our fingers crossed!!)

On January 30, 2024, US Senators Roger Wicker (MS) and Richard Blumenthal (CT) introduced <u>S.3690</u>, the Senate companion bill to H.R.4006, <u>introduced last June</u>. Both bills reflect the Congressional campaign efforts by <u>ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio</u>® to eliminate homeowner association land use restrictions that prohibit, restrict, or impair the ability of an Amateur Radio Operator to install and operate amateur station antennas on residential properties they own.

Amateur Radio Operators repeatedly are relied upon to provide essential communications when disaster strikes, but their ability to do so is being impaired by the exponential growth of residential private land use restrictions that hinder their ability to establish stations in their homes with which to train and provide emergency communications when called upon.

In announcing the introduction of S.3690, Senator Wicker said: "Because communication during natural disasters is often hindered, we should be making every attempt to give folks more options. Reliable access can make the difference between life and death in an emergency. Our legislation removes roadblocks for amateur radio operators looking to help their friends, families, and neighbors."

In a similar announcement, Senator Blumenthal stated: "Our measure will help clarify the rules so ham radio enthusiasts can successfully continue their communications. In the face of emergency or crisis, they help provide vital, life-saving information that allow listeners to properly and safely respond, but prohibitive home association rules and confusing approval processes for installing antennas have been an unnecessary impediment. The Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act resolves these bottlenecks and ensures that radio operators can function successfully."
