Greetings!

Hope everyone is having a good summer and are able to stay cool!

At our upcoming meeting, we will be showcasing the Yaesu FT-710 transceiver. Our equipment committee was tasked with deciding what to buy for any field operations we will be doing in the future. The committee looked at the Icom IC-7300, Yaesu FT-710 AESS, Yaesu FTdx-10 and the Yaesu FT-991A. Also some QRP rigs, but it was decided that qrp was not the way to go.

The Yaesu radios came out on top. They have very easy menu systems and are very compact. The FT-710 was chosen because of its easy to use menu system, 100 watts of power and very small size, great for portable work. A video monitor can also be connected to the radio. Digital mode, such as FT8 can be setup easily since all audio functions are built into the radio. A small laptop would also be needed for digital.

Jerry Aceto, K6LIE, will bring his FT-710 AESS, 22 inch monitor and an antenna system so the members present at the meeting can take a close look at the operation of this radio and decide if they agree with the committee. If so, the club can purchase this rig along with whatever accessories are deemed necessary by the membership.

The Duke City Hamfest will be September 19, 20 and 21. Vice President Sean O'Mara, AI5IZ, has secured a club table and we will be asking for members to man our table in 2 hour shifts, so no one misses all that will be going on at the event. More on the Hamfest on page 4 of this newsletter.



UKRAINE PROJECT UPDATE

ART NICHOLS KI5GOL

The Ukraine is in a bit of a mess right now and these nonmilitary mobile radios have become indispensable for humanitarian efforts. Right now Care4Ukraine (C4U) is in great need of mobile radios. BARC has sent them many handhelds and a few of the Yaesu FT-3100 or the ICOM IC-2300H. Buying them in the US and shipping them to Poland is just too expensive. Buying them in the EU is a much less expensive effort, however, the ICOM's are hard to come by over in the EU so we have a fall-back of the Yaesu FT-2980. We have contacted a radio store in France who currently has a large supply. We have sent an email with plans to purchase 12 of the Yaesu radios (of either type) and are currently waiting to hear back from them. The plan is to either ship the radios to Poland or someone from C4U will travel to pick them up.

AUGUST PROGRAM

In addition to showcasing the Yaesu FT-710 AESS to the members, John Mocho, KC5QOC, will demonstrate the Rattlegram software. This app allows you to send text messages cell phone to cell phone or handheld to cellphone. It's based on COFDM (coded orthogonal frequency-division multiplexing) technology. You type some text, the app does the OFDM encoding and DAC and then spits the resulting noise out of the speaker. The sound is then received by the same app on another phone (in 'listening' mode) and then ADC'd and decoded back into text.

Bring your handheld and cell phone and John will demonstrate at our August meeting. This software is available free on the Play Store.
